Antarctic Tasmania invites you to attend the 2009, 2nd International Forum on the Sub-Antarctic to be held in Hobart, Tasmania 26–27 April 2009.

The 2009 forum follows on from the very successful 2006 International Forum on the Sub-Antarctic which attracted over 120 delegates from 11 countries.

The 2006 forum marked a significant turning point in developing the view that the Sub-Antarctic region should be classified not as a subdivision of the Antarctic, but as its own distinct circumpolar domain which has its own unique character, scientific significance and management issues. Proceedings from the 2006 forum are available in book format from The Royal Society of Tasmania for A\$50 (www.sub-antarctic.org/docs/subantproceedings.pdf).

Titled "Environmental Change in the Sub-Antarctic", the 2009 forum will feature many local and international speakers presenting on a range of subjects covering:

- change in Sub-Antarctic system during the recent past, circa 1800 – mid 20th Century
- change in the modern era of science and environmental consciousness
- dynamic interactions in the Sub-Antarctic system
- managing and adapting to environmental and ecological changes
- what the future holds for the Sub-Antarctic region

The 2009 International Forum on the Sub-Antarctic follows the Antarctic Climate and Ecosystems Collaborative Research Centre (ACE CRC) forum on monitoring of climate change impacts 20–24 April 2009, also to be held in Hobart, which will enable interested parties to easily attend both forums.

The steering committee for the 2009 forum includes Sir Guy Green (Honorary Antarctic Ambassador), Professor Bruce Mapstone (former CEO, ACE CRC), Professor Michael Stoddart (Formerly Chief Scientist Australian Antarctic Division), Dr Denzil Miller (Executive Secretary, CCAMLR), Professor Pat Quilty (Honorary Research Professor, University of Tasmania), Dr Patricia Selkirk (Senior Research Fellow, Macquarie University) and Ben Galbraith (Director, Antarctic Tasmania).
